2015 NEW ENGLAND CAROL CONTEST GUIDELINES

The winning entry will be performed during the CAS 2015-16 concert season.

2015 Contest Guidelines

Premiere: no prior public performance of submitted composition
Voicing: a cappella, SATB setting with divisi up to SSATB

• Duration: about 3 minutes

• Difficulty: like carols represented, for example, in 100 Carols for Choirs (Willcocks, Rutter; eds.)

• Text: new settings in English of traditional texts, published poems, or original texts.

It is the composer's responsibility to secure copyright permission for any text not in the public domain.

• Applicant requirement: native-born or current resident of one of the six New England states (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont) or composer currently studying in residence at a New England college, university, or conservatory.

Prizes

- \$500 cash prize
- up to \$250 travel expense to attend premiere with possible opportunity for media coverage

Submission Process

- e-mail to contest@choralart.org the following required components:
 - o signed and completed application form
 - o pdf of carol submitted using carol title as name; no composer name attached
 - o mp3 audio file of carol using carol title as name; no composer name attached
 - o not required: pdf of piano reduction of vocal parts, if possible, using carol title as name; no composer name attached

Deadline

• e-mail received before 6:00 p.m. EDT on June 1, 2015

Winner Announcement

• winning composer to be notified via e-mail on July 15, 2015

Note: The composer retains all rights of publication and future performances. The Choral Art Society reserves the right for unlimited future performances at no additional expense.
